



## Reflections on Water

### 1:00 – 5:00 Tour - PINEMAP Rainfall Exclusion & Fertilization Study (Host: Rodney Will)

The tour will leave from the Kiamichi Forest Research Station in Idabel - Tour limited to 30 participants.

We will tour a stand-level research project that was installed to determine the effects of a drier climate and nutrient availability on loblolly pine stand growth and biology. The mechanisms of stand growth and their relation to potential climate change will be discussed. State-of-the-art techniques for the measurement of tree physiology will be demonstrated. This research is part of the region-wide PINEMAP research effort.

### 11:00 – 5:00 Tour – Historic Washington State Park (Host: Patricia Thomas)

The cost of this tour is \$25. Pre-registration required to attend. Limited to first 40 participants.

Travel to the 19th Century in Historic Washington, Arkansas, a premier historic village established on George Washington's birthday in 1824. Visit more than 30 fully restored historic structures featuring hand-hewn timber framing and examples of Southern Greek Revival and Federal architecture. Tour the buildings and homes, see a remarkable collection of antiques, guns, knives and visit with guides dressed in period attire for an unforgettable experience. Fee includes lunch at Williams Tavern Restaurant.

### 1:00 – 5:00 Tour - The Southwest Research and Extension Center (Host: Victor Ford)

Meet at the Southwest Research and Extension Center located in Hope, Arkansas, (870) 777-9702, 362 Highway 174 North, Hope, AR 71801. Directions at http://swrec.uark.edu

The Southwest Research and Extension Center has a long history of forest research and focuses on the needs of southern Arkansas especially to small landowners and small farms. This tour will highlight oak species comparisons, SMZ management, pine genetics testing, wildlife food plots, native savanna restoration, hybrid poplar on uplands, and uneven-aged management.

### 12:30 – 4:30 Tour – Red River Army Depot (Host: Cliff Sunda)

Meet in a vacant parking lot at building 110 at the Red River Army Depot, Hooks, TX next to the TexAmericas Center offices. Limited to first 40 registrants. (Optional BBO sandwich plate = \$10.00)

Each participant must provide name, date of birth, and either driver's license number or SS# for entry onto the depot. The natural resource manager and forester will then talk about the forestry program and how it supports the mission of the facility, the forest management strategies, and discuss how Army forestry works. Participants will then board busses and visit four sites in the field and have discussions at each.
